- Read textbooks regularly at home as instructed by the teacher.
- Speak only in English in school except in case of second and third language periods.
- Participate in sports and cultural activities organised by the school.
- Watch English news and other recommended programs on television only.









School Rules

- The following rules need to be adhered to for the smooth functioning of school activities by students and assistance of parents to ensure that they are followed.
- Parents should check the homework given regularly and also ensure that their child has completed it correctly and on time.
- Students should always be neatly dressed with their shoes polished and hair done properly. Girls with very short hair should wear black hair band. Those with shoulder length hair should make a pony tail with black rubber band. Long hair should be neatly tied and pinned. Finger nails must be cut short and kept clean.
- Encourage your child to take a balanced interest in studies, curricular activities and sports.
- There should be a name tag on jackets, sweaters, bag, geometry box/pencil box etc.
- The medium of instruction is English. Moreover, the school emphasizes on developing communication skills; hence it becomes all the more important for all the students to converse in English.
- Discipline, regular attendance, study habits, polite and courteous behavior is expected from students at all times.
- Students are not allowed to bring valuables like jewelry, cell phones or carry any money to school.
- No students should damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the wall. Any willful damage done by a student to the school building or property will be considered as a serious offence and parents/guardians will be liable to pay for the damage.
- Students are not permitted to wear chains, fancy ornaments or any type of trinkets, rings, anklets, nail polish and fancy frills.
- Cygnites should remember that the school is judged by the behavior and conduct of its students.
 Therefore, they should always be disciplined, polite and courteous while in school and while outside.
- No student is allowed to celebrate his/her birthday by distributing sweets or any articles in the classroom or in the premises of the school.
- This is a co-educational school; complete harmony is expected among the students.
- No students shall indulge in any of the following practices:
 - Chewing or spitting gum
 - Disfiguring walls and furniture
 - Rude or Violent behaviour
 - Use of abusive language
- Students are not allowed to use the office telephone without the permission of the office-in-charge. Students will not be permitted to attend telephone calls during school hours unless the calls are very urgent.
- The school will organize Parent Enrichment Sessions and Open Days at regular intervals. It is expected that both parents attend the meetings, however it is compulsory for the either of the parents to attend the meeting.
- It is always advisable to write to the school about the problem of your child or for seeking guidance. A solution will be conveyed after discussion with the concerned teacher.
- The students shall always greet their teachers, elders and friends politely in the school or outside.
- They shall respect their parents and teachers and accept their advice and guidance cheerfully.



Assessment and Evaluation

- Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) is undertaken by the school which refers to a
 system of school-based evaluation of the students that covers all aspects of students'
 development. It includes assessment in scholastic as well as co-scholastic aspects of the
 pupil's growth.
- A progress report will be issued presenting the performance of the child at the end of every term.

<u>NOTE</u>: In case parents have a more suitable vendor, they may purchase the required materials from there.

Important Note:

In case the children do not wear the prescribed uniform as per the schedule, they would be excused twice. The third time they would be sent home. Parents would need to come and pick up their children in such a case.

In case any child is not wearing the prescribed school uniform, the parent should inform the teacher through a Whats app message specifying the reason for the same.

II) <u>Haircut & Accessories:</u>

- <u>Girls</u> All hair accessories should be **BLACK** in colour. E.g.: hair bands, hair clips,rubber bands. Girls should not wear fancy jewelry / accessories to school. They can only wear earrings or studs or hoops in the ears. Parents will ensure that **NO** fancy hairstyles are allowed for children in school. In case the hair is long, it should be neatly tied and pinned properly.
- <u>Boys</u> Parents will ensure that the haircut of the children should be decent,
 preferably, an army cut. No fancy haircuts are allowed in school.
- School uniform is compulsory on all occasions, unless it is specified by the



school.

- For grade IX upwards- With the growing age, the students and their parents can use their discretion to choose full pants in the summer as well for both the sets of uniform if they wish.
- <u>Socks</u>- Parents will see that children wear washed school socks everyday with elastic intact.
- School Shoes: Parents will ensure that the children wear only school shoes on all days. On days of group games, students should carry their sports shoes along with them and change before and after the games period.
- Bathroom slippers should **NOT** be worn to school. Instead, floaters can be used in case of an emergency.
- If a child has reported to school, except in case of a medical emergency, the child will not be allowed to leave school before the scheduled time.
- Under no other circumstances, should the parents request for early leave from school at any time. In case the child has not been keeping well the child should not come to school instead of early departure for any medical appointment (until and unless an exam is scheduled on that day). If a passport appointment is fixed for a particular day, parents should not send the child to school on that day instead of asking for early departure.
- It is suggested that parents help their children pack their bags as per the timetable so that they become aware of what their children are carrying with them.
- Parents should encourage and ensure that their wards are not using social media i.e. Facebook, Instagram etc. Implications of using such platforms need to be discussed with children. It is important to make them understand that the same can be devastating for their future.
- Two-wheelers are strictly not allowed for students. Strict disciplinary action would be taken if any child is found driving a two-wheeler to school.



III) Field Trips:



- Send a snack box with healthy fun food.
- •A cap and water bottle is compulsory.
- The uniform should be worn as per the schedule / time table of the day.

IV) School Bus:

- No food is allowed to be carried and eaten on the bus.
- Parents should be at the bus stop a few minutes before the arrival of the bus.
- If for any reason, a parent misses the bus, he / she will not try to stop the bus on the road, instead should try to reach the next bus stop.
- The school bus is punctual but drop off can vary 5 minutes, depending on the traffic on the roads. (CCTV cameras have been installed in all the buses and are being regularly monitored by the school authorities. Getting up from the seats on the moving bus will not be accepted.)
- Inculcate a good habit in your children to be punctual and on time at the bus stop.

V) <u>Library Books:</u>

- The primary students can borrow one book at a time during their library period. If the book is lost / misplaced, twice the actual cost of the book, will be charged to the parents.
- We need to inculcate in children, respect for books and teach them to handle books in a better way. This will go a long way in building effective life skills in children.
- For the students of Middle School (Grade VI –VIII) 1 library book will be issued during their Library period.



• For Secondary and Senior Secondary students 2 books will be issued during their Library period.

VI) School Bags:

- Parents should see that their children do not bring fancy / travel bags to school. Children should bring simple school bags which are not heavy to carry.
- Children should bring books to school only as per the class timetable.

- No discussions on telephone are permitted.
- HOMEWORK WILL BE POSTED IN CONTENT LIBRARY SUBJECT SECTIONS on MS Teams.
- All the circulars / important messages will be posted on the Cygnus World School App and on the Class Whats App Groups.
- Appointment with Principal / HOD / Coordinator has to be taken by the parent through an email.
- Appointment with the class / subject teacher has to be taken by the parent over a Whats App message / email.
- A page titled "Communication with Parents" will get created on MS teams for communication between the teacher and the parent.
- The parents can communicate their concerns with the teachers through Whats App.
- The parent needs to inform the teacher regarding leaves through an email / Whats App.
- The school conducts periodic Parent-Teacher Interactions as mentioned in the school's Calendar of Events.



VIII) Personal Hygiene:

- All children should carry a handkerchief to school every day.
- Nails should be kept clean and cut short.
- Children should wear neat and clean clothes.
- Well cut and groomed hair for boys.







IX) Leave:

- We encourage children to attend school regularly and award a merit certificate for full attendance. Regularity in school helps children to learn well, get adjusted to school routine and systems.
- In case of sickness, parents should mention the reason for absence to the concerned class teacher through an email.
- Parents should use only school vacations to visit relatives and for pleasure travel.
- It is compulsory for the children to be present on the last working day before the vacation and the first working day after the reopening of the vacation.
- In case the child is absent on any of these days a medical proof / written application / email has to be sent stating the reason for leave.
- No leave is granted for part of the day, please.

X) Meals:

- The lunch menu for the entire month will be posted on our website.

XI) Evaluations:

• <u>Grade I-V</u>: If a child is absent for either Unit Test or Half Yearly Examination or Annual Examination, the child will be marked absent. Under no circumstances, will the exam be rescheduled.





• Grade VI-XII: If a child is absent for any Written (Unit Tests) Assessment / Half Yearly / Annual Exam / Pre-Board Exam, the child will be marked absent. Under no circumstances will the exam be rescheduled.

XII) Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for Discipline at school:

- The level of one's success is determined by one's level of discipline and perseverance.
- Keeping this in mind, Cygnus World School has laid down the following Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) to maintain appropriate discipline & accountability among our students. The following procedure is to help, improve, correct, prevent and not punish, humiliate or retaliate.
- To ensure appropriate discipline at school a system of YELLOW, RED and BLACK CARDS is being introduced.
- The School Discipline committee will comprise 3 to 4 members (teachers).
- The committee will meet every Saturday and look into all the reports and issues related to student discipline.

- If a child gets 4 yellow cards over a period of time in a session, the parents will be called to school. The child under such circumstances will be issued a RED card in presence of the parents.
- In case a child gets 8 yellow cards and 1 Red card he/she will get a BLACK card and then it may lead to suspension / expulsion from school.
- However, RED and BLACK cards will be issued after considerable



deliberation. The parents will be informed when such an incident occurs and before the School Discipline Committee meets to discuss the issue. The student who is in question will be called and given an opportunity to present his case. Based on his explanation and the available evidences, the action to be taken would be decided. Decision once taken by the committee should be considered final. Strictly no interference will be tolerated by the parents in the same.

- Extreme cases of indiscipline may also result in suspension / expulsion.
- This SOP is being followed since the session 2020-21.

XIII) Miscellaneous:

- A set of underclothes, T-shirt / pant / skirt should be sent with the child in a labeled plastic bag to be kept in the school for emergency usage for students of **Grade I & II.**

- ❖ It helps build 21st Century skills needed for success and the attributes required to apply those skills to their best effect. With Creya learning, students show significant improvements in areas such as collaborative learning, use of experience and questioning. It aligns with our school curriculum and seamlessly integrates into our existing calendar and academics.
- ❖ At the heart of Creya, is the belief that learning is a cycle based on experience, analysis, reflection and connection to real world situations. Creya is designed to be an experiential program that drives children to apply what they learn in school and find facts rather than memorize them.



A brief about the different aspects covered under Creya are as follows:

1. Coding with Tynker: Students learn and explore block-coding in Tynker. Tynker provides everything needed to learn computer programming in a fun

- Candidates are exposed to the pattern of both the assessments through explicit instructions and samples at school.

GUIDELINES FOR ASSESSMENT OF SPEAKING SKILLS

- The total administration time for the speaking assessment is 3-5 minutes.
- The activity is conducted for two candidates at a time i.e. students are assessed in pairs.
- The teacher / examiner reserves the discretion to form pairs of the test taking students.
- Candidates are assessed on the following parameters:

SPEAKING ASSESSMENT IS DIVIDED INTO TWO SECTIONS:

1. GENERAL INTRODUCTION (1 Minute)

The examiner wishes and welcomes the candidates to initiate the conversation and asks simple warm-up questions based on candidates' names, place of residence, leisure preferences etc.

2. TOPIC PRESENTATION (2-3 Minutes)

For the above-mentioned, the students are provided with 5-6 broad themes and are instructed to select a topic of their choice under any one of the provided themes. On the day of the assessment each student is given one minute to present his / her ideas. At the end of each presentation, the partner (second student in the pair) asks the speaker a question followed by one or two questions asked by the examiner.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS FOR LISTENING SKILLS

- The total administration time for the listening assessment is 40 minutes.
- The students are not allowed to ask questions or interrupt the examiner at anypoint.
- A recording will be played twice. In case there is an oral rendering of the listening input, it shall take place twice.
- Students are required to answer a set of questions based on the listening input.
- The test paper is given before the recording is played.
- Students are suggested to familiarize themselves with the questions on the worksheet. This helps them to answer the questions later.
- After the students have listened to the input, they are to answer the questions in the specified time period.
- They may answer the questions on their worksheet while listening as well.
- Students should not interact or comment until they have moved out of the examination room.
